Problem

Once Mannkind Corporation transitioned to a fleet program, Andrew St Germain, Director Commercial Excellence, was adamant about not leaving driver risk management to chance. One important area was the need to better identify and address red flags in employee's driving records (like DUIs and license suspensions) as they were happening, and not months down the line.
